The author argues the advantages of hand loom weaving and concludes that, "there can be no question that the best weaving was done before [the] innovations of the engineer and mechanician were made. It would therefore seem, that the right road to improvement in weaving, as in all the crafts, can only be found by those who are willing to return to the traditional methods and simpler ideals of the earlier masters of craftsmanship."
