FIRST STATE OF THE FIRST OZ BOOK

1. Baum, L. Frank. *The Wonderful Wizard of Oz.* 261 pp. Illus. by W.W. Denslow with 24 tipped-in color plates, plus numerous duotone illustrations in the text; pictorial pastedowns. Light green cloth pictorially stamped in green & red. First Edition, First State.

Chicago: Geo. M. Hill, 1900.

Hanff & Greene I, plate I - First state of the first edition of the first Oz book, in binding state B (Geo. M. Hill stamped on spine in red, in plain unserifed type): the publisher's advertisement on p.[2] is enclosed in a box; p.14, line 1 has "low wail on..."; p.81, fourth line from bottom has "peices"; p.[227], line 1 begins "While Tin Woodman..."; the colophon at the end of the book is set in 11 lines and is enclosed in a box; perfect type on p.100, last line, and perfect type on p.186, last line; the color plate facing p.34 has 2 dark-blue blots on the moon, and the plate facing page 92 has red shading on the horizon. However, the verso of the title-page has a printed copyright notice, a point associated with the first state; the first state as listed in Hanff & Greene had the verso of the title-page blank or with a rubberstamped copyright notice. In this copy, the plate which should face page 14 faces page 12, a variant listed by Hanff and Greene. Expertly recased, some wear at spine ends and corners, minor cover soiling, a little wrinkling to the spine; wear along the endpaper hinges, occasional minor soiling within, a few pages with corners creased, else a very good, recased copy, much nicer than normally seen. Hanff & Greene, I - Second state with no box around the publisher's advertisement on p.2; "low wail of..." (p.14, line 1); the word "pieces" spelled correctly (p.81, 4th line from bottom); p.[227] begins with the words "While the woodman..."; imperfect type on last line of pp.100 & 186; plate facing p.92 without red shading on the horizon; and the colophon reset in 13 lines with no box. However, as in the first state, the verso of title page is blank, and the color plate facing p.34 has two dark-blue blots on the moon. The binding has the variant "C" spine imprint with publisher's name in serifed type, stamped in red, the `C' of "Co." encircling the `o'. Inscription on front free endpaper "To Warren, from Santa Claus, 1903," with Warren H. Stoddard's rubberstamp on the front free endpaper and both rear endpapers. Recased with some rubbing to the covers, especially joints, some insect damage, wear to the spine ends; hinges cracked at endpapers, some soiling and fairly minor, mostly marginal staining, small blue stain to verso of title-page and recto of following leaf, short

repaired marginal tear to plate facing p.14, small chip and short repaired tear to lower margin of plate facing p.20, affecting slightly the caption, plates facing pp. 34, 44 and 160 with short repaired tear to lower margin, plate facing p.80 trimmed and mounted on backing leaf repairing a few tears and creases, overall in good to very good condition.

Hanff & Greene I, Plate 2 - The first state of the second edition, with the title on the cover stamped "The New Wizard of Oz." The copyright is in state "A" with the copyright statement at the top of the page and the printer's imprint at the bottom. Four puncture holes in the spine and one in the front joint, some rubbing to covers, faint staining, spine ends frayed; hinges cracked at endpapers and a few places within, shaken; lacking pp. 259-261, pp. [19]-20 torn about 6" up and across, several other pages with shorter tears, pp. 175-6 torn along gutter so partially detached, mild vertical crease to first 65 pages, bookplate on front pastedown; lacking the plates which should face p.160 & 184 some penciling to plates facing pp. 34 & 198, 2" tear to plate facing p.66, good condition, perhaps the most difficult of all the Oz editions to find. Hanff & Greene I, Plate 3 - The second state of the second edition, with the title on the cover stamped "The Wizard of Oz" (dropping the "New"). Earliest issue, with a period following the author's name on the spine; "The" at the top of the spine in unserified type; the crow's eye on the front cover stamped in orange; the illustration on p.49 at the bottom of the page; no type damage or resetting of type to the top of lines of pp. 169 and [7]; and the illustration of the crying lion is on p.68 (later substituted for with the worried lion on p.64). The copyright page is a variant, having no publisher's imprint at the bottom. Laid in is the small engraved card of a Mr. Charles Warren, with handwritten inscription, "For Brooke, from...Remember you promised not to feel insulted, Xmas 1903." Spine darkened and rubbed, ends & corners worn, some minor cover rubbing, leaning; else very good, quite clean internally. (300/500).

Hanff & Greene I - Early issue, with illustrations on pp.[195]-[261] printed in orange, and the witch's hat present on p.[137]. Light rubbing to ends and corners, leaning, front hinge a little loose, still a near fine, bright copy.

Hanff & Green I (page 34), Plate 4 - Jacket with approx. 1" pieces missing from spine ends, worn at folds, a few other chips and small tears, price clipped; vol. spine with light vertical crease, leaning a bit, else near fine in very good jacket.

Hanff & Greene I, Plates 8 & 9 - The dust jacket shows the four main characters, and Toto too, surrounding the bald, short Wizard. The jacket lacks the lower 2" of the spine strip, other chipping, creasing and wear; vol. with light bumps at spine ends, top of rear cover and bottom of front cover, two tiny pinholes in top right corner of front cover; small nametag on top right corner of title-page, else a nearly fine copy, internally clean and fine, in fair to good jacket. Hanff & Greene II, Plate 21 - First state with the full title on front cover and spine; spine with horizontal single rule at top and double rule at bottom and with picture of Jinjur in navy blue and green; the illustrations are reversed from their intended order on pages [22] and [27], as well as on pages [82] and [158]; and the box containing the dedication on p.[4] measures 6-1/4" tall. Binding B with letters in "Marvelous Land of Oz" on front cover embellished with silver outlines. Rubbing, staining and insect damage to the covers, wear at ends and corners, leaning; hinges cracked at endpapers, just occasional light foxing to contents, including the titlepage, about very good. Hanff & Greene, II - Binding B with letters in "Marvelous Land of Oz" on front cover embellished with silver outlines. Second state with the line "Published, July, 1904" added below the copyright notice on verso of title page; illustration on page [4] has been considerably reduced: the box is 5-3/8" tall; illustrations on pp. [22] & [27] are transposed, and tailpieces on pp. 82 & 158 are also transposed. Some rubbing to covers, spine faded, worn at ends, corners showing; hinges repaired at endpapers, front pastedown chipped, torn and reapaired, rear free endpaper partially detached; several tears to the margins of the text pages or the plates are repaired, several plates inserted at the wrong place but all present, some other wear overall in very good condition. Hanff & Greene II - *The Marvelous Land of Oz* with the shortened title. The title-page has been type-set, with author credits through *Tik-Tok of Oz*. Contains 12 color states (as the 6th state), but with captions present (as with the 5th, most copies of which contained 16 plates), indicating an intermediate state. The rare dust jacket is printed in green on an offwhite stock, with pictorial on front panel like that on the front cover of the book, on the rear panel is an advertisement for Oz books listing titles through *The Lost Princess of Oz*; on the front flap is an advertisement for *The Twinkle Tales* by Laura Bancroft [i.e. L. Frank Baum], and on the rear flap an ad for *Baum's Snuggle Tales*. Hanff and Greene note that the Sixth Printing of *The Land of Oz* came out about 1917, the date of the publication of *The Lost Princess of Oz*. Jacket soiled, chips at corners and spine ends, a few short tears and small edge chips; vol. with just slight rubbing to spine ends and corners; hinge cracking before title, 1" tear to lower margin of pp.145-6, else a near fine, bright copy in very good jacket. Hanff & Greene II, Plate 22 - Not to be confused with the oversized 1939 Popular Edition, which did not have the color frontispiece. A little shelf wear, spine sunned a touch, lower corners a bit bumped; very good or better condition.

Hanff & Greene II, Plate 26 - The jacket is the original for this oversized Popular Edition, listing titles through *Ozoplaning with the Wizard of Oz* (1939). The jacket is well worn and creased, rubbed at folds, some chipping, 6" tear to rear panel repaired with tape on recto, several verso tape repairs, 3x4" triangular piece

missing from lower left of rear panel, price clipped; vol. rubbed at top and bottom cover edges, corners showing, bookplate on front free endpaper, near fine in fair to good jacket. (100/150).

13. Baum, L. Frank. *The Land of Oz: A Sequel to the Wizard of Oz.* 287 pp. Illus. in black & white by John R. Neill. 9-1/2x7, color pictorial boards, green cloth spine. "Popular Edition." Chicago: Reilly & Lee, 1939.

Hanff & Greene II, Plate 26 - The oversized Popular Edition. Rubbing to board edges, corners showing; front hinge a little loose, very good or better. (80/120).

Hanff & Greene III, Plate 28; Baughman 23 - First state with advertisements facing half-title and on last page listing two titles: *The Land of Oz* and *John Dough and the Cherub*; illus. on p.[221] in color; pictorial endpapers. In this copy, the "O" in "Ozma," line five of the Author's Note on p.11, is present; apparently it dropped out at some point of the first press run, indicating this to be an early copy. Also, pp. 135-[136], [153]-154, and [221]-222 are integral; Hanff and Greene indicate that there was apparently smudging or offset to the coloring of those pages which occurred during printing and stacking of the sheets, and the worst of them were excised and replaced after the books were assembled. In the primary binding, with "The Reilly &/ Britton Co." at foot of spine. This copy formerly belonged to Charleton Heston's mother, with "Bessie and May Charlton" written in ink on the ownership-page, and signature of May Charlton in pencil in the top margin of the front free endpaper. Some soiling and extremity wear to covers, spine ends fraying, corners showing, joints reglued repairing a few splits; repairs to hinges at endpapers, else very good. (600/900).

In this copy, the "O" in "Ozma," line five of the Author's Note on p.11, is present; apparently it dropped out at some point of the first press run, indicating this to be an early copy. In the primary binding, with "The Reilly &/ Britton Co." at foot of spine. Rebacked with the original spine strip laid on (except top -1/2"),

some soiling to both spine and covers, corners worn; repairs to endpaper hinges, ownership-page filled out in ink, half-title with ink inscription dated 1907, occasional soiling within, good to very good. (300/500).

In this copy, the "O" in "Ozma," line five of the Author's Note on p.11, is present; apparently it dropped out at some point of the first press run, indicating this to be an early copy. Also, pp. 135-[136], [153]-154, and [221]-222 are integral; Hanff and Greene indicate that there was apparently smudging or offset to the coloring of those pages which occurred during printing and stacking of the sheets, and the worst of them were excised and replaced after the books were assembled. In the secondary binding, with "Reilly &/ Britton" at foot of spine. Hanff and Greene note that "one copy has been seen with blank endpapers." This could be that one. Five of the black and white illustrations have rather good hand water-coloring, but there are flecks of paint to some of the adjacent pages. Binding worn at spine ends and corners, some rubbing and soiling, mild rippling to the cloth; a little shaken, else very good. (400/700).

Hanff & Greene IV, plate 32 - First state with advertisement on verso of half-title listing three titles, *The Land of Oz, Ozma of Oz*, and *John Dough and the Cherub*; the color plates are captioned. In the primary binding, with "The Reilly &/ Britton Co." in large and small caps at foot of spine. This book and the *Emerald City of Oz* are the only Oz books for which John R. Neill created finished watercolor paintings for the color plates, having done line drawings for all the other titles, which were then colored by the printer. Light scratches and some tarnishing to the cover label, mild rubbing to spine ends and corners, light waterstain to lower corner of rear cover, very slight at lower corner of front cover and the corners of the pages within (more noticable on a few of the plates); wear along the endpaper hinges, else very good, nicer than it sounds. Hanff & Greene IV, plate 32 - First state with advertisement on verso of half-title listing three titles, *The Land of Oz*, *Ozma of Oz*, and *John Dough and the Cherub*; the color plates are captioned. In the primary binding, with "The Reilly &/ Britton Co." in large and small caps at foot of spine. This book and the *Emerald City of Oz* are the only Oz books for which John R. Neill created finished watercolor paintings for the color plates, having done line drawings for all the other titles, which were then colored by the printer. Light scratches and some tarnishing to the cover label, rubbing to spine ends and corners; wear along the endpaper hinges, front cracking, frontis. torn 2" up gutter then 1-1/2" into image, title-page torn 2-1/2" from lower edge across imprint, plate facing p.100 with lower margin creased, plated facing p.192 split 1" up gutter margin, pp.241-2 with -1/2x2" piece missing from lower margin, else very good. (500/800).

23. Baum, L. Frank. *Dorothy and the Wizard in Oz.* 226 pp. 9x6-1/2, red cloth, pictorial cover label, jacket.

Hanff & Greene IV, Plate 33 - The cover label is the same as that of the 1930 "Popular Edition," but with those words deleted. The dust jacket lists titles through *The Silver Princess in Oz* on the flaps. Soiling to jacket, large chip to spine head, smaller one to foot, a few small edge tears and chips, price clipped; light shelf wear, offset to endpapers, else near fine in very good jacket. (150/250).

24. Baum, L. Frank. *Dorothy and the Wizard in Oz.* 226 pp. 9x6-1/2, orange cloth, pictorial cover label, jacket.

Hanff & Greene IV, Plate 33 - The cover label is the same as that of the 1930 "Popular Edition," but with those words deleted. The dust jacket lists titles through $Magical\ Mimics\ in\ Oz\ (1946)$ on the flaps. Light soiling to the jacket, several small chips and tears to the edges; light shelf wear, offset to endpapers, else near fine in very good jacket. (100/150).

Hanff & Greene V, plate 36 - First state with 2 ad pages at end; p.[263] listing Baum books published under pseudonym "Laura Bancroft;" p.[264] listing the 4 Baum titles, *The Land of Oz*, *Ozma of Oz*, *Dorothy and the Wizard of Oz*, and *John Dough and the Cherub*; gatherings printed on tinted stocks arranged in the order called for by Hanff & Greene; rear cover with silhouette portraits of Dorothy and Ozma; spine imprint printed in small caps. Without damaged type on p.34, line 4 ("Toto on"); but with damaged type to the numeral on p.121; without the numeral and caption present beneath the illus. on p.129. Some rubbing and soiling to the cloth, mostly the spine; front hinge tender, ownership-page filled out in pencil, occasional minor soiling, a few pages with short tears in the lower margin, else very good. Covers well rubbed and soiled, spine illustration all but rubbed off, spine ends frayed, corners showing; hinges repaired at endpapers, ink presentation inscription on ownership page dated 1913, else good.
